[Passed March 5, 1959; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section fifteen, article five, chapter seven of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the auditing and payment of claims of justices and constables; annual statement of sheriff of fines and costs received from justices; payment into state treasury.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section fifteen, article five, chapter seven of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 15. Auditing and Payment of Claims of Justices
2 and Constables; Annual Statement of Sheriff of Fines and

Costs Received from Justices; Payment into State Treasury.—All claims by justices and constables for fees due them in misdemeanor proceedings in the county instituted before them on and after the effective date of this section, 6 shall be audited and examined by the county court, and if found correct and if submitted, as provided in section fourteen, article seventeen, chapter fifty of this code, the 9 10 county court shall cause orders to be issued therefor on 11 the sheriff to be paid out of the general school fund or out 12 of the general county fund, as the court may direct. The sheriff shall annually, during the month of January, ren-13 der under oath to the auditor a true statement of the ac-14 15 count of all fines and costs collected by justices and trans-16 mitted to him and pay into the treasury of the state, the 17 net proceeds of such fines and costs as exhibited by such 18 account, to be appropriated as directed by the fifth section 19 of article twelve of the constitution; failure so to do shall be deemed a breach of his official duty. For the purposes 20 21 of this section, the net proceeds of such fines and costs shall be deemed to be the proceeds remaining after de-23 ducting therefrom the lawful fees of constables and jus-

- 24 tices of the peace; cost of auditing the accounts of justices
- 25 of the peace and constables by the chief inspector's office;
- 26 and expenses for operation and maintenance of the county
- 27 jail.
