AN ACT to amend and reenact section thirty-seven, article fifteen, chapter seventeen-c of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to general restrictions as to tire equipment; special permits for the operation of traction engines or tractors having movable tracks and certain farm tractors and machinery; the use on the highways of this state of tires fitted with blocks, studs, flanges, cleats, or spikes or any other protuberances of any material other than rubber; and rules and regulations and approval of the state road commissioner with respect of such tires.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section thirty-seven, article fifteen, chapter seventeen-c of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Article 15. Equipment.

Section 37. Restrictions as to Tire Equipment; Rules

- 2 and Regulations as to Certain Tires.—(a) Every solid rub-
- 3 ber tire on a vehicle shall have rubber on its entire
- 4 traction surface at least one inch thick above the edge of
- 5 the flange of the entire periphery.
- 6 (b) No person shall operate or move on any highway
- 7 any motor vehicle, trailer, or semi-trailer having any
- 8 metal tire in contact with the roadway.
- 9 (c) No tire on a vehicle moved on a highway shall
- 10 have on its periphery any block, stud, flange, cleat, or
- 11 spike or any other protuberance of any material other
- 12 than rubber which projects beyond the tread of the
- 13 traction surface of the tire, except that it shall be per-
- 14 missible to use farm machinery with tires having pro-
- 15 tubrances which will not injure the highway and except
- 16 also that it shall be permissible to use tire chains of rea-
- 17 sonable proportions upon any vehicle when required for
- 18 safety because of snow, ice, or other conditions tending
- 19 to cause a vehicle to skid.
- 20 (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections
- 21 (b) and (c) of this section, a person may use motor

22 vehicle tires on the highways of this state which are 23 fitted with blocks, studs, flanges, cleats, or spikes or any other protuberances of any material other than rubber 24 if and when (1) the state road commissioner has pre-25 scribed rules and regulations authorizing such use, (2) 26 27 such tires are used in strict conformity with any such rules and regulations, and (3) such tires are of a type 28 29 approved by the state road commissioner. Any rules and 30 regulations perscribed by the state road commissioner, which he is hereby authorized to promulgate, shall relate 31 to the design, construction and use of such tires and the 32 procedure which shall be followed when such tires are 33 34 submitted for approval. 35

35 (e) The state road commission and local authorities
36 in their respective jurisdictions may in their discretion
37 issue special permits authorizing the operation upon the
38 highway of traction engines or tractors having movable
39 tracks with transverse corrugations upon the periphery
40 of such movable tracks or farm tractors or other farm
41 machinery, the operation of which upon a highway would
42 otherwise be prohibited under this chapter.
