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

AN ACT to amend and reenact §17C-15-26 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to authorizing fire department-owned apparatus to use yellow or amber flashing lights for safety.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §17C-15-26 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

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ARTICLE 15. EQUIPMENT.

§17C-15-26. Special restrictions on lamps.

- 1 (a) Any lighted lamp or illuminating device upon a
 2 motor vehicle other than head lamps, spot lamps,
 3 auxiliary lamps or flashing front-direction signals
 4 which projects a beam of light of an intensity greater
 5 than three hundred candlepower shall be so directed
 6 that no part of the beam will strike the level of the
 7 roadway on which the vehicle stands at a distance of
- 8 more than seventy-five feet from the vehicle.
- 9 (b) No person shall drive or move any vehicle or equipment upon any highway with any lamp or device thereon displaying other than a white or amber light visible from directly in front of the center thereof except as authorized by subsection (d) of this section.
- 14 (c) Except as authorized in subsections (d) and (f) of
 15 this section and authorized in section nineteen of this
 16 article, flashing lights are prohibited on motor vehicles:
 17 Provided, That any vehicle as a means for indicating
 18 right or left turn or any vehicle as a means of indicating
 19 the same is disabled or otherwise stopped for an
 20 emergency may have blinking or flashing lights.
- 21 (d) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this 22 chapter, the following colors of flashing warning lights 23 are restricted for the use of the type of vehicle 24 designated:
- 25 (1) Blue flashing warning lights are restricted to police 26 vehicles. Authorization for police vehicles shall be 27 designated by the chief administrative official of each 28 police department.

- 29 (2) Except for standard vehicle equipment authorized
- 30 by section nineteen of this article, red flashing warning
- 31 lights are restricted to the following:
- 32 (A) Ambulances;
- 33 (B) Fire-fighting vehicles;
- 34 (C) Hazardous material response vehicles;
- 35 (D) Industrial fire brigade vehicles;
- 36 (E) Rescue squad vehicles not operating out of a fire
- 37 department;
- 38 (F) School buses;
- 39 (G) Class A vehicles, as defined by section one, article
- 40 ten, chapter seventeen-a of this code, of those
- 41 firefighters who are authorized by their fire chiefs to
- 42 have the lights;
- 43 (H) Class A vehicles of members of duly chartered
- rescue squads not operating out of a fire department;
- 45 (I) Class A vehicles of members of ambulance services
- or duly chartered rescue squads who are authorized by
- 47 their respective chiefs to have the lights;
- 48 (J) Class A vehicles of out-of-state residents who are
- 49 active members of West Virginia fire departments,
- 50 ambulance services or duly chartered rescue squads
- 51 who are authorized by their respective chiefs to have
- 52 the lights; and
- 53 (K) West Virginia Department of Agriculture

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- 54 emergency response vehicles.
- Red flashing warning lights attached to a Class A
- vehicle shall be operated only when responding to or
- 57 engaged in handling an emergency requiring the
- attention of the firefighters, members of the ambulance
- 59 services or chartered rescue squads.
- 60 (3) The use of red flashing warning lights shall be
- 61 authorized as follows:
- 62 (A) Authorization for all ambulances shall be
- designated by the Department of Health and Human
- Resources and the sheriff of the county of residence.
- 65 (B) Authorization for all fire department vehicles shall
- 66 be designated by the fire chief and the State Fire
- 67 Marshal's office.
- 68 (C) Authorization for all hazardous material response
- 69 vehicles and industrial fire brigades shall be designated
- 70 by the chief of the fire department and the State Fire
- 71 Marshal's office.
- 72 (D) Authorization for all rescue squad vehicles not
- 73 operating out of a fire department shall be designated
- by the squad chief, the sheriff of the county of residence
- and the Department of Health and Human Resources.
- 76 (E) Authorization for school buses shall be designated
- 77 as set out in section twelve, article fourteen of this
- 78 chapter.
- 79 (F) Authorization for firefighters to operate Class A
- vehicles shall be designated by their fire chiefs and the
- 81 State Fire Marshal's office.

- 82 (G) Authorization for members of ambulance services
- 83 or any other emergency medical service personnel to
- 84 operate Class A vehicles shall be designated by their
- 85 chief official, the Department of Health and Human
- 86 Resources and the sheriff of the county of residence.
- 87 (H) Authorization for members of duly chartered
- 88 rescue squads not operating out of a fire department to
- 89 operate Class A vehicles shall be designated by their
- 90 squad chiefs, the sheriff of the county of residence and
- 91 the Department of Health and Human Resources.
- 92 (I) Authorization for out-of-state residents operating
- 93 Class A vehicles who are active members of a West
- 94 Virginia fire department, ambulance services or duly
- 95 chartered rescue squads shall be designated by their
- 96 respective chiefs.
- .97 (J) Authorization for West Virginia Department of
- 98 Agriculture emergency response vehicles shall be
- 99 designated by the Commissioner of the Department of
- 100 Agriculture.
- 101 (4) Yellow or amber flashing warning lights are
- 102 restricted to the following:
- 103 (A) All other emergency vehicles, including tow trucks
- and wreckers, authorized by this chapter and by section
- twenty-seven of this article;
- 106 (B) Postal service vehicles and rural mail carriers, as
- 107 authorized in section nineteen of this article;
- 108 (C) Rural newspaper delivery vehicles;
- 109 (D) Flag car services;

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- 110 (E) Vehicles providing road service to disabled
- 111 vehicles;
- (F) Service vehicles of a public service corporation;
- (G) Snow removal equipment;
- 114 (H) School buses; and
- 115 (I) Automotive fire apparatus owned by a
- 116 municipality or other political subdivision, by a
- volunteer or part-volunteer fire company or department
- 118 or by an industrial fire brigade.
- 119 (5) The use of yellow or amber flashing warning lights
- 120 shall be authorized as follows:
- 121 (A) Authorization for tow trucks, wreckers, rural
- 122 newspaper delivery vehicles, flag car services, vehicles
- 123 providing road service to disabled vehicles, service
- vehicles of a public service corporation and postal
- service vehicles shall be designated by the sheriff of the
- 126 county of residence.
- 127 (B) Authorization for snow removal equipment shall
- 128 be designated by the Commissioner of the Division of
- 129 Highways.
- 130 (C) Authorization for school buses shall be designated
- as set out in section twelve, article fourteen of this
- 132 chapter.
- 133 (D) Authorization for automotive fire apparatus shall
- be designated by the fire chief in conformity with the
- NFPA 1901 standard for automotive fire apparatus as
- published by the National Fire Protection Association

- 137 (NFPA) on the eighteenth day of July, two thousand
- three, and adopted by the State Fire Commission by 138
- 139 legislative rule (87 CSR 1, et seq.), except as follows:
- 140 (i) With the approval of the State Fire Marshal, used
- automotive fire apparatus may be conformed to the 141
- 142 NFPA standard in effect on the date of its manufacture
- or conformed to a later NFPA standard; and 143
- 144 (ii) Automotive fire apparatus may be equipped with
- 145 blinking or flashing headlamps.
- 146 (e) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this
- 147 section, any vehicle belonging to a county board of
- 148 education, an organization receiving funding from the
- 149 state or Federal Transit Administration for the purpose
- 150 of providing general public transportation or hauling
- 151 solid waste may be equipped with a white flashing
- 152 strobotron warning light. This strobe light may be
- 153 installed on the roof of a school bus, a public
- 154 transportation vehicle or a vehicle hauling solid waste
- 155 not to exceed one-third the body length forward from
- 156
- the rear of the roof edge. The light shall have a single
- 157 clear lens emitting light three hundred sixty degrees
- around its vertical axis and may not extend above the 158
- 159 roof more than six and one-half inches. A manual
- 160 switch and a pilot light must be included to indicate the
- 161 light is in operation.
- 162 . (f) It shall be unlawful for flashing warning lights of
- an unauthorized color to be installed or used on a 163
- 164 vehicle other than as specified in this section, except
- 165 that a police vehicle may be equipped with either or
- 166 both blue or red warning lights.
