ENROLLED BILL

(H. B. No. 267)

[Passed February 17, 1931; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and re-enact subsection (d) of section fifty-four of an act of the legislature of West Virginia, passed on the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine, known as senate bill number seven, relating to the charter of the city of Parkersburg, and being chapter one of the acts of the legislature of West Virginia of one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine, relating to municipal charters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That subsection (d) of section fifty-four of an act of the legislature of West Virginia passed on the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine, known as senate bill number seven, relating to the charter of the city of Parkersburg, and being chapter one of the acts of the legislature of West Virginia of one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine, relating to municipal charters be, and the same is hereby amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Section 54 (d). From and after the passage of this act, no one shall be eligible to participate in the benefits of any such pension fund:

(1) Who does not possess all the qualifications, and who has not complied with all conditions therefor, prescribed by the charter of the city of Parkersburg, and the general law, not in conflict therewith; or

(2) Who has not been regularly and permanently appointed to the department in the benefits of whose pension fund he seeks to participate, after examination and recommendation by the civil service board provided for in section twenty-eight of the charter of the city of Parkersburg; or

(3) Who was so regularly and permanently appointed to any such department after the passage of this act and who, at the time of his said appointment, was over thirty-five years of age; or

(4) Who has not passed the physical examination prescribed by the trustees of such pension fund.

All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.
