ENROLLED BILL

(H. B. No. 311)

[Passed March 13, 1931; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT relating to the salary of assistant prosecuting attorney in the county of Mercer.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1. Beginning January first, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three, the county court of Mercer county shall pay to the assistant prosecuting attorney as annual compensation not less than one thousand four hundred dollars and not in excess of three thousand six hundred dollars, payable monthly.

All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
