ENROLLED BILL

(H. B. No. 69)

[Passed March 12, 1931; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT making it unlawful for non-residents of the state of West Virginia to buy any furs in the state without first having secured a license therefor, and fixing the amount of said license and the manner of securing the same.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1. That no person who is a non-resident of the state shall, without a state license therefor, buy or offer to buy, any fur, pelt, hide, or skins, within the state of West Virginia. License shall be secured in the same manner and from the same source as other state licenses, and the license fee shall be fifty dollars; and any violation of this section will be subject to the same punishment as provided in section two, of article twelve, of chapter eleven, of the code.
