ENROLLED BILL

(S. B. No. 131)

[Passed March 14, 1931; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to provide for the redemption of real estate, delinquent for the non-payment of taxes thereon for the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight and one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, by the payment of the original tax thereon within specified limitations of time; and relating to charges, claims and rights arising through such delinquency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1. The owner of real estate delinquent for the non-
2 payment of taxes for the years one thousand nine hundred and
3 twenty-eight and one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine
4 may have the right to redeem the same as hereinafter set out.

5 The owner of such delinquent real estate for the years afore-
6 said may, on or before May thirty-first, one thousand nine hun-
7 dred and thirty-one, redeem such real estate by the payment to
8 the state auditor, as provided by general law relating to de-
9 linquent real estate and redemptions applicable to such taxes
10 in effect at the time of the passage of this act, of the original
11 amount shown by the tax ticket for the taxes for which said
12 real estate is delinquent; and no fees, percentages, commis-
13 sions, penalties or costs of any kind whatsoever shall be added
14 to the original amount aforesaid. Such payment shall dis-
15 charge in full the liabilities of such owner on all fees, percent-
16 ages, commissions, penalties and costs which might have been
17 added under the provisions of such general law, and all claims
18 thereon of the state of West Virginia and of any county, dis-
19 trict or municipality thereof, which might have arisen under
20 such general law against such owner; and thereupon all rights
21 that might have been acquired by compliance with the pro-
22 visions of such general law, shall vest in such owner.

23 The general provisions of this act likewise applies to de-
24 linquent municipal real estate not certified to the state auditor
25 when delinquent and the delinquent taxes on such real estate,

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26 now in the hands of the municipal collector, may be paid to
27 such collector and such real estate so redeemed.

28 Such owner aforesaid may in like manner pay such taxes
29 after May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-
30 one, but not later than November thirtieth, one thousand nine
31 hundred and thirty-one, with interest at the rate of ten per
32 centum per annum from January first, one thousand nine hun-
33 dred and thirty-one, until paid, with the same rights and privi-
34 leges otherwise provided for herein. Such taxes as may be
35 paid shall be paid to the state auditor until October one, one
36 thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and after that date to
37 the sheriff.

38 This act shall be in effect until and including November
39 thirtieth, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and shall
40 not be in effect after that date.
