## ENROLLED BILL

(S. B. No. 133)

[Passed March 13, 1931; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend article one of chapter twenty-five of the official code of West Virginia, by adding thereto a new section to be designated as section twenty-four, relating to the payment of compensation to employees and inmates of benevolent, educational, correctional and penal institutions of the state, the fiscal affairs of which are under the control and management of the state board of control, who shall have received personal injuries in the course of and resulting from their employment, and to dependents of such employees and inmates in ease death ensues by reason of such injuries.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That article one of chapter twenty-five of the official code of West Virginia be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated as section twenty-four, reading as follows:

Section 24. The state board of control is authorized to award  
2 and to pay employees or inmates of the several state institutions  
3 enumerated in sections three and four of this article, who shall  
4 have received personal injuries in the course of and resulting  
5 from their employment or work to which they have been  
6 assigned, when such injuries are not self inflicted or caused by  
7 the wilful misconduct or the disobedience of such rules and  
8 regulations as may be adopted for the government of employees,  
9 or to dependents, if any, of such employee in case death ensues  
10 by reason of such injuries, compensation in the amount, and in  
11 the manner provided by the workmen's compensation law as  
12 contained in sections five, six, seven, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen,  
13 fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen and eighteen of article four  
14 of chapter forty-three of the code, and all the powers conferred  
15 upon the state compensation commissioner by said sections shall,  
16 so far as they may be made applicable, are hereby conferred  
17 upon, and may be exercised by the state board of control.

18 Compensation payable hereunder shall be paid out of the  
19 current general expense fund of the institution by which the  
20 injured or deceased employee was employed, and in case there  
21 is not, and will not become available, sufficient funds in the  
22 general expense fund of any institution for making payment  
23 of awards to its injured employees or their dependents here-  
24 under, the state board of control shall certify such fact, to-  
25 gether with the amount necessary to meet the payments under  
26 such awards to the board of public works and said board may  
27 include in the budget to be next thereafter transmitted by it to  
28 the legislature, an amount sufficient to meet the payments under  
29 such awards for the next two ensuing years.
