## ENROLLED BILL

(S. B. No. 136)

[Passed February 25, 1931; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and re-enact sections two, three, four, five and twenty-nine of article four of chapter nineteen of the official code of West Virginia, relating to cooperative and agricultural credit associations.

## Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That sections two, three, four, five and twenty-nine of article four of chapter nineteen of the official code of West Virginia be, and they are, hereby amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

Section 2. Five or more persons engaged in the production 2 of agricultural products may form a nonprofit, cooperative asso-3 ciation, and/or agricultural credit association, with or without 4 capital stock, and five or more cooperative associations may form 5 an agricultural credit association, and/or cooperative associa-

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6 tion, with or without capital stock, under the provisions of this 7 article.

Sec. 3. A cooperative association may be organized to engage 2 in any activity in connection with the marketing or selling of 3 the agricultural products of its members or those purchased 4 from other persons, or with the harvesting, preserving, drying, 5 processing, canning, packing, grading, storing, handling, ship-6 ping or utilization thereof, or the manufacturing or marketing 7 of the by-products thereof; or in connection with the manu-8 facturing, selling or supplying to its members of machinery, 9 equipment or supplies; or in securing and disseminating market 10 information; or in the financing directly, through agricultural 11 credit associations, and/or otherwise, the above enumerated ac-12 tivities; or in any one or more of the activities specified herein. 13 An agricultural credit association may be organized hereunder 14 to finance persons engaged in the production of agricultural 15 products and/or to finance any cooperative association, whether 16 formed under the laws of this or any other state.

- Sec. 4. A cooperative association shall have the following 2 powers:
- 3 (a) To engage in any activity in connection with the market-

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4 ing, selling, preserving, harvesting, drying, processing, manu5 facturing, canning, packing, grading, storing, handling or utili6 zation of any agricultural products produced or delivered to
7 it by its members or purchased or received by consignment
8 from other persons, or the manufacturing or marketing of the
9 by-products thereof; or any activity in connection with the
10 purchase, hiring, or use by its members of supplies, machinery,
11 or equipment; or in securing and disseminating market in12 formation; or in the financing, directly, through agricultural
13 credit associations, and/or otherwise, any such activities; or in
14 any one or more of the activities specified in this section: Pro15 vided, however, That all transactions with nonmembers shall be
16 on terms fixed by the association, and such nonmembers shall
17 not otherwise participate in any benefits derived from such
18 transactions;

19 (b) To borrow money without limitation as to amount of 20 corporate indebtedness or liability, and to make advance pay-21 ments and advances to members; to execute, issue, draw, make, 22 accept, endorse, and guarantee, without limitation, promissory 23 notes, bills of exchange, drafts, warrants, certificates, mortgages, 24 and any other form of obligation or negotiable or transferable

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25 bills of any kind; to become the surety, guarantor, maker, 26 and/or endorser for accommodation or otherwise of bills, notes. 27 securities, and other evidences of debt of any association or 28 person, anything in any other statute or law of this state to the 29 contrary notwithstanding;

- 30 (c) To act as the agent or representative of any member or 31 members in any of the above mentioned activities;
- 32 (d) To purchase or otherwise acquire, and to hold, own, and 33 exercise all rights of ownership in, and to sell, transfer or 34 pledge, or guarantee the payment of dividends or interest on. 35 or the retirement or redemption of, shares of the capital stock 36 or bonds of any corporation or association engaged in any re-37 lated activity or in the warehousing or handling or marketing 38 of any of the products handled by the association:
- (e) To establish reserves and to invest the funds thereof in 40 bonds or in such other property as may be provided in the by-41 laws;
- (f) To buy, hold and exercise all privileges of ownership 43 over real or personal property as may be necessary or con-44 venient for the conduct and operation of any of the business of 45 the association, or incidental thereto;

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(g) To establish, secure, own and develop patents, trade-47 marks and copyrights:

(h) To do each and every thing necessary, suitable or proper 49 for the accomplishment of any one of the purposes or the 50 attainment of any one or more of the subjects herein enumer-51 ated, or conducive to or expedient for the interest or benefit of 52 the association; and to contract accordingly; and, in addition, 53 to exercise and possess all powers, rights and privileges neces-54 sary or incidental to the purposes for which the association is 55 organized or to the activities in which it is engaged, and any 56 other rights, powers, and privileges granted by the laws of this 57 state to ordinary corporations, except such as are inconsistent 58 with the purposes of this article; and to do any such thing any-59 where. An agricultural credit association shall have all of the 60 powers given to a cooperative association under the provisions 61 of subdivision (b) of section four of this article and in general 62 shall have power to do and perform any act or thing, not in-63 consistent with law, which may be appropriate to promote and 64 attain the objects and purposes of such credit association.

Under the terms and conditions prescribed in the 2 by-laws adopted by it, a cooperative association may admit as

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3 members, or issue common stock to, only persons engaged in the 4 production or cooperative marketing of the agricultural prod5 ucts to be handled by or through the association, and any lessor 6 or landlord who receives as rent all or any part of the crop 7 raised on the leased premises; and under the terms and condi8 tions prescribed in the by-laws adopted by it, an agricultural 9 credit association may admit any person as a member.

10 If a member of a nonstock association be other than a natural 11 person, such member may be represented by an individual, asso-12 ciate, officer or manager or member thereof, duly authorized in 13 writing.

One association organized hereunder may become a member 15 or stockholder of any other association or associations organized 16 under this article or similar laws of any state.

Sec. 29. The provisions of the general corporation laws of 2 this state and all powers and rights thereunder shall apply to 3 the associations organized under this article and may be used 4 by them, except where such provisions are in conflict with or 5 inconsistent with the express purposes of this article.
