ENROLLED BILL

(H. B. No. 204)

[Passed June 3, 1933; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT making appropriations of public moneys out of the treasury, in accordance with the provisions of the amendment to the constitution of the state of West Virginia, known as the "Budget Amendment."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1. That there be and are hereby appropriated out of the treasury for the fiscal year ending June thirty, one thousand nine hundred thirty-four, and for the fiscal year ending June thirty, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five and for the remainder of the fiscal year ending June thirty, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three, the following sums of money for the following named purposes:

Sec. 2. The amounts appearing in the column headed "1934" are for the fiscal year ending June thirty, one thousand nine hundred thirty-four and the amounts appearing in the column headed "1935" are for the fiscal year ending June thirty, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five.

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Sec. 3. All appropriations appearing under sub-sections
2 "A" and "B" are payable out of the general revenue of the
3 State unless otherwise provided herein.

Sec. 4. No payments shall be made from appropriations ap-
2 pearing in sub-sections "A" and "B", which appropriations are
3 designated, "Payable out of collections," in excess of the
4 amounts therein set forth, and no payments shall be made in
5 excess of the amount of collections, for the particular institu-
6 tion, department, commission or board, paid into the general
7 revenue of the state under the provisions of section two, article
8 two, chapter twelve of the Code of one thousand nine hundred
9 thirty-one.

10 Payments may be made from said appropriations appearing
11 herein at any time during the fiscal year so long as the aggre-
12 gate for the year does not exceed the amount of the appropria-
13 tion and does not exceed the collections that will be made for
14 the year and paid into the general revenue of the state.
