(H. B. No. 220)

[Passed June 3, 1933; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to authorize the boards of education of Grant district, Kingwood district, Lyon district, Pleasant district, Portland district, Reno district, Union district, and Valley district, of Preston county, to transfer school funds, excepting proceeds of bond issues or moneys raised by levy for the purpose of meeting interest and sinking fund requirements of outstanding bond issues, from any school fund or funds in which there is a balance to any other school fund or funds in which there is a deficit, under their control, for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1. The respective boards of education of Grant dis-2 triet, Kingwood district, Lyon district, Pleasant district, Port-3 land district, Reno district, Union district and Valley district,
