## ENROLLED BILL

(H. B. No. 221)

[Passed June 3, 1933; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to authorize the respective boards of education of Center-ville district, Ellsworth district, Lincoln district, McElroy district, Meade district, Union district and Sistersville Independent School district, of Tyler county, to transfer elementary and new building school funds to their respective teachers' funds for the purpose of meeting obligations for the payment of teachers' salaries for the present fiscal year.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

Section 1. The respective boards of education of Center-ville district, Ellsworth district, Lincoln district, McElroy district, Meade district, Union district and Sistersville Independent School district, of Tyler county, are hereby authorized to transfer surplus money from the maintenance fund and new building fund to the elementary teachers' funds of the said respective districts for the purpose of meeting obligations against
