## ENROLLED BILL

(S. B. No. 132)

[Passed March 23, 1934; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact sub-section (c), section five, article XII-A, chapter thirty-three, acts of the Legislature of West Virginia, first extraordinary session, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three, imposing a privilege tax on railroad car corporations and on express companies.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

(c) The tax as to railroad car corporations and as to  
 2 express corporations or companies shall be one and one-half  
 3 per cent of net income earned within the state, such income  
 4 to be determined by ascertaining a sum bearing the proportion  
 5 to the total net income of the corporation or company that its  
 6 business done in West Virginia, measured in car-mile of car  
 7 operation, bears to all business done, measured in like fashion:
