ENROLLED BILL

(S. B. No. 33)

[Passed February 28, 1933; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section three, article seven, chapter sixty-one of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, relating to the carrying of dangerous or deadly weapons.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section three, article seven, chapter sixty-one of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, be amended and reenacted so as to read as follows:

Section 3. Nothing in this article shall prevent any person
2 from carrying any such weapon as is mentioned in the first
3 section of this article, in good faith and not having felonious
4 purposes, upon his own premises; nor shall anything herein
5 prevent a person from carrying any such weapon, unloaded,
6 from the place of purchase to his home or residence, or to a
7 place of repair and back to his home or residence; nor shall

8 anything herein prevent a bona fide member of the national
9 guard of West Virginia, or of the reserve officers component
10 of the United States army, while in performance of his official
11 duties as such or any properly organized target shooting club
12 authorized by law to obtain firearms by purchase or requisition
13 from this state or from the United States for the purpose of
14 target practice, from carrying any revolver or pistol mentioned
15 in this article, unloaded, from his home or place of residence to
16 a place of target practice, and from any such place of target
17 practice back to his home or residence, or using any such
18 weapon at such place of target practice in training and im-
19 proving his skill in the use of such weapons; but nothing herein
20 shall be construed to authorize any employee of any person,
21 firm or corporation doing business in this state to carry, on or
22 about the premises of such employer, any such pistol, or other
23 weapon mentioned in this article, for which a license is herein
24 required, without having first obtained the license and given
25 the bond as herein provided.
