AN ACT to provide for the use of safety glass in motor vehicles
and providing penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1. On and after July first, one thousand nine hun-
2 dred thirty-five, and except as hereinafter otherwise provided,
3 it shall be unlawful to operate, on any public highway or street
4 in this state, any motor vehicle which is registered in this
5 state, and which shall have been manufactured or assembled
6 on or after July first, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five,
7 unless such motor vehicle be equipped with safety glass

8 wherever glass is used in partitions, doors, windows or wind-
9 shields.

Sec. 2. The term "safety glass", as used in this act shall
2 be construed as meaning glass so treated or combined with
3 other materials as to reduce, in comparison with ordinary
4 sheet glass or plate glass, the likelihood of injury to persons
5 by objects from external sources or by glass when the glass is
6 cracked or broken.

Sec. 3. The provisions of this act shall not apply to any
2 private passenger motor vehicle of less than eight passenger
3 seating capacity which is not used for carrying passengers for
4 compensation or hire, or to any truck owned by a farmer and
5 used principally for transporting farm produce, equipment or
6 materials to, from or upon his farm, if such private passenger
7 motor vehicle or farm truck shall have been registered
8 previously in another state by the owner while the owner was
9 a bona fide resident of such other state.

Sec. 4. The state road commissioner shall approve and
2 maintain a list of the approved types of glass, conforming to
3 the specifications and requirements for safety glass as set forth
4 in this act and in accordance with the standards recognized by

5 the United States bureau of standards, and shall not issue a
6 license for or relicense any motor vehicle subject to the provisions
7 of this act, unless such motor vehicle be equipped as herein
8 provided with such approved type of glass.

Sec. 5. The operator, owner, or custodian of any motor
2 vehicle which is operated in violation of the provisions of this
3 act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon con-
4 viction thereof shall be fined twenty-five dollars or be impris-
5 oned ten days in jail or both. In case of the violation of the
6 provisions of this act by any common carrier or person oper-
7 ating under a permit or certificate issued by the public service
8 commission, such permit or certificate shall be revoked, or, in
9 the discretion of the commission, suspended until the provisions
10 of this act are satisfactorily complied with.
