[Passed June 17, 1936; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to provide a moratorium for the institution and prosecution of suits for the sale of forfeited or escheated lands.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1.—*Suits for Sale of Forfeited or Escheated*
2 *Lands*—Notwithstanding the provisions of section ten, article
3 three, chapter thirty-seven of the code of West Virginia, as
4 amended by chapter eighteen, acts of the Legislature, first
5 extraordinary session, one thousand nine hundred thirty-
6 three, no suit shall be instituted or prosecuted for the sale of
7 forfeited or escheated lands until after the thirtieth day
8 of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven: *Provided,*
9 That such suit may be instituted and prosecuted at any time
10 at the instance and request of the former owner or owners

11 of any particular tract or tracts of land, or of a redeemable
12 interest or interests therein, or such suit may be instituted
13 and prosecuted at any time at the express direction and
14 order of the court.
