## ENROLLED House Bill No. 3

(By Mr. Thomas)

[Passed June 17, 1936; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to provide a moratorium for the institution and prosecution of suits for the sale of forfeited or escheated lands.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1.—Suits for Sale of Forfeited or Escheated 2 Lands-Notwithstanding the provisions of section ten, article three, chapter thirty-seven of the code of West Virginia, as 3 amended by chapter eighteen, acts of the Legislature, first 4 extraordinary session, one thousand nine hundred thirty-5 6 three, no suit shall be instituted or prosecuted for the sale of 7 forfeited or escheated lands until after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven: Provided, 8 That such suit may be instituted and prosecuted at any time 9 10 at the instance and request of the former owner or owners Enrolled H. of any particular tract or tracts of land, or of a redeemable
interest or interests therein, or such suit may be instituted
and prosecuted at any time at the express direction and
order of the court.
