Senate Bill No. 18

(By MR. RANDOLPH and MR. BARNHART)

[Passed June 20, 1936; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT establishing a West Virginia Commission on Interstate
Cooperation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1. There is hereby established the West Virginia
2 Commission on Interstate Cooperation, which shall encourage
3 and arrange conferences with officials of other states and of
4 other units of government; carry forward the participation
5 of this state as a member of the Council of State Govern-
6 ments, both regionally and nationally; and formulate pro-
7 posals for cooperation between this state and other states.

Sec. 2. There is hereby established a standing Committee

2 on Interstate Cooperation of the Senate, to consist of three
3 Senators. The members and chairman of this committee shall
4 be designated in the same manner as is customary in the case
5 of the members and chairman of other standing committees
6 of the Senate. The President of the Senate may serve as
7 one of the three members of this committee.

Sec. 3. There is hereby established a similar standing
2 Committee on Interstate Cooperation of the House of Dele-
3 gates, also to consist of three members; and the members and
4 chairman of this committee shall be designated in the same
5 manner as is customary in the case of the members and
6 chairman of other standing committees of the House of Dele-
7 gates.

Sec. 4. The said Commission on Interstate Cooperation
2 shall be composed of twelve members, namely:

3 The three members of the Committee on Interstate Co-
4 operation of the Senate;

5 The three members of the Committee on Interstate Co-
6 operation of the House of Delegates;

7 Three private citizens of the state named by the governor;
8 and

9 Three officials of the state government named by the gover-
10 nor, one of whom shall be designated by him as the chairman
11 of the commission.

12 The governor shall be an honorary member of the com-
13 mission.

Sec. 5. The commission shall establish such committees as
2 it deems advisable, to conduct conferences and to formulate
3 proposals concerning subjects of intergovernmental coopera-
4 tion. Subject to the approval of the commission, the mem-
5 bers of every such committee shall be appointed by the chair-
6 man of the commission. State officials who are not members
7 of the commission on Interstate Cooperation may be ap-
8 pointed as members of any such committee, but at least one
9 member of the commission shall be a member of every such
10 committee. The commission may provide such rules as it
11 considers appropriate concerning the membership and the
12 functioning of any committee which it establishes. The com-
13 mission may provide for advisory boards for itself and for
14 its various committees, and for the service of private citizens
15 on such boards.

Sec. 6. The commission shall report to the governor and to

2 the legislature within fifteen days after the convening of
3 each regular legislative session, and at such other times as it
4 deems appropriate. Its members and the members of all
5 committees which it establishes shall serve without compensa-
6 tion.

Sec. 7. The said standing committee of the Senate and the
2 said standing committee of the House of Delegates, shall
3 function during the regular sessions of the legislature and
4 also during the interim periods between such sessions; their
5 members shall serve until their successors are designated;
6 and they shall respectively constitute the Senate and House
7 Councils of the American Legislators' Association for this
8 state. The term of each administrative member of the com-
9 mission shall extend until the next gubernatorial inaugura-
10 tion and thereafter until his successor is appointed.
