AN ACT to amend and reenact section five, article three, chapter forty-four of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, relating to the duties of commissioner of accounts and fiduciaries of estates.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section five, article three, chapter forty-four of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 5. *Commissioner of Accounts to Inspect Inventories and Accounts.* The commissioner of accounts shall inspect all inventories and accounts of sales returned to him by fiduciaries, require the same to be executed in duplicate and in proper form, and, within ten days after they are respectively received and approved by him, deliver one copy thereof

7 to the clerk of the county court and mail one copy to the
8 tax commissioner of West Virginia. Any commissioner of
9 accounts who fails, refuses or declines to comply with the pro-
10 visions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and
11 shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not less than
12 twenty-five dollars nor more than five hundred dollars.
