AN ACT to amend and reenact section three, article three, chapter five of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, relating to assistants attorney general.

*Be It Enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That section three, article three, chapter five of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, relating to assistant attorneys general, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 3. *Assistants to Attorney General.* The attorney  
2 general may appoint four assistants to serve at his pleasure  
3 and to perform such duties as he may require of them. They  
4 shall each receive a salary not in excess of four thousand  
5 eight hundred dollars per annum. And upon finding of the

6 necessity therefor by the Governor and attorney general, the  
7 attorney general may appoint not more than one special  
8 assistant to serve at his pleasure and to perform such duties  
9 as he may require of him for such time as the Governor and  
10 attorney general determine the necessity to continue, and he  
11 shall for the time actually employed receive a salary not to  
12 exceed four hundred dollars per month.
