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House Bill No. 48

(By MR. JONES, of McDowell)

[Passed March 9, 1937; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section one, article thirteen, chapter eighteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended and reenacted by chapter twelve, acts of the Legislature, first extraordinary session, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three, relating to West Virginia State College.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section one, article thirteen, chapter eighteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended by chapter twelve, acts of the Legislature, first extraordinary session, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three, be amended and reenacted so as to read as follows:

Article 13.

Section 1. *Continuation and Management of West Virginia*

2 *State College.* The institution for the instruction of colored
3 students heretofore established and located at Institute, in
4 Kanawha county, shall be continued and shall be known as
5 the "West Virginia State College." The educational affairs
6 of said college shall be under the control, supervision and
7 management of the state board of education and the negro
8 board of education, as provided in sections thirteen and six-
9 teen, article two of this chapter, and its financial and business
10 affairs shall be under the charge and control of the state board
11 of control as provided in section four, article one, chapter
12 twenty-five of the code.

13 The said joint boards of education shall establish and
14 maintain in the West Virginia State College, in addition to
15 the departments already established, such professional and
16 graduate schools and college courses of study as may be ex-
17 pedient and practicable, and shall prescribe the conditions for
18 graduation therefrom and make rules for the conferring of
19 degrees and for issuing the proper diplomas to those who
20 complete such courses.

21 The rules and regulations made by the president and fac-

22 ulty of said college for its general government for the ad-
23 mission of students thereto, the standards of scholarship to
24 be maintained therein, and the graduation of students there-
25 from, shall be submitted to the said joint boards of education
26 for their approval.

27 The West Virginia State College shall have the power and
28 authority to do extension work in agriculture, home econom-
29 ics, mining, and such other subjects as the said joint boards
30 of education may direct among the negro population of West
31 Virginia. For the purpose of teaching Negro boys and girls
32 the Four-H standards of living and to inspire them to lift
33 themselves toward these standards, and to discover and train
34 negro boys and girls for leadership, and for the purpose of
35 teaching standards of excellence in agriculture, soil conser-
36 vation, vocational agriculture and home economics, a Four-H
37 camp, institute and state exhibit for negroes is hereby es-
38 tablished. It shall be the duty of the state board of control
39 to secure a site for the aforesaid camp, institute and state
40 exhibit at some suitable place and to erect the necessary
41 buildings and provide necessary and suitable equipment for
42 carrying out the purposes aforesaid. It shall be the duty of

43 the state board of control, when such grounds and buildings
44 are provided and equipped, as above stated, to turn same
45 over to the department of agriculture of the West Virginia
46 State College, to be operated by the extension division of
47 said college in carrying out the purposes and intents here-
48 in set forth, and in the same manner as at the Four-H camp
49 at Jackson's Mill. When not in use by the extension divi-
50 sion of said college and under its regulation, this equipment
51 may be rented to other organizations for convention use, and
52 the funds received as rent or other collections shall be by
53 such extension division turned over to the board of control
54 for deposit in the state treasury to the credit of collections
55 from said state college as required by section two, article
56 two, chapter twelve, for special funds mentioned in sub-
57 section (b) of said section two. Any appropriations here-
58 after made to carry out the provisions and purposes of this
59 section shall be expended through the state board of control.
60 The county court may appropriate money from the county
61 fund to erect county buildings on such Four-H camp prop-
62 erty as mentioned in this section, and such buildings shall

63 be operated so as to carry out the provisions and purposes
64 set forth in this section.
