AN ACT to amend and reenact section eighteen, chapter sixty, acts of the Legislature of West Virginia, regular session, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three, relating to political activities of members of fire departments under civil service.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That section eighteen, chapter sixty, acts of the Legislature of West Virginia, regular session, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 18. No member of any fire department within the  
2 terms of this act shall engage in any political activity of any

3 kind, character or nature whatsoever, except to cast his vote  
4 at any election, and shall not act as an officer of election  
5 in any election, municipal or general. Any member of any  
6 fire department engaging in any political activity herein  
7 prohibited shall be subject to dismissal, as provided by the  
8 provisions of this act.
