House Bill No. 281

(BY MR. ALEXANDER)

[Passed February 16, 1939; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to name and permanently designate an interstate bridge
on West Virginia state route number forty-five, connecting
with Maryland route number thirty-four, crossing the Potomac
river at the city of Shepherdstown, West Virginia, as the James
Rumsey bridge.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1. *The James Rumsey Bridge.* The highway bridge
2 on West Virginia state route number forty-five, connecting
3 with Maryland route number thirty-four and crossing over
4 the Potomac river at Shepherdstown, Jefferson county, West
5 Virginia, shall hereafter be known and is hereby officially
6 designated as the James Rumsey bridge. The historical
7 society of Jefferson county and other organizations of that
8 county may conduct appropriate public dedication ceremonies

9 to effectuate this act, and may join with the state of Maryland,
10 or any body or organization representing the state of Mary-
11 land, in joint dedication ceremonies at such time and place
12 as shall be deemed appropriate during the year one thousand
13 nine hundred thirty-nine: *Provided, however,* That the state
14 of West Virginia shall incur no expense as a result of such
15 dedication ceremonies.
