(By MR. JIMISON, by request)

[Passed March 3, 1939; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT authorizing the county court of Kanawha county, West Virginia, to pay certain medical, hospital and transportation expenses of George Dudley, a former deputy sheriff of Kanawha county, wounded while in the performance of his duties as deputy sheriff.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

Section 1. The county court of Kanawha county is authorized and empowered to pay to George Dudley, a former deputy sheriff of Kanawha county, certain medical, hospital and transportation expenses already accrued, or which may in the future accrue, incurred by the said George Dudley in the treatment of a certain bullet wound received by him while in

7 the performance of his duties while transporting a dangerous
8 criminal from the Kanawha county jail to the West Virginia
9 state penitentiary at Moundsville, West Virginia, when at-
10 tacked and severely wounded by outlaws. Said court is
11 hereby authorized to make provision in its annual budget, be-
12 ginning with the budget for the fiscal year one thousand nine
13 hundred thirty-nine and one thousand nine hundred and forty,
14 to pay for such expenses accrued, or which may in the future
15 accrue.
