ENROLLED House Bill No. 254

(By Mr. Speaker, Mr. Thomas)

[Passed March 2, 1939; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section eleven, article two, chapter sixty of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as enacted by chapter four, acts of the Legislature, regular session, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five, relating to the state control of alcoholic liquors.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section eleven, article two, chapter sixty of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as enacted by chapter four, acts of the Legislature, regular session, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five, relating to the state control of alcoholic liquors, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Article 2. Liquor Control Commission.

Section 11. Powers and Duties of Commission. The state

2 liquor commission shall have the following powers and duties

- 3 and any and all other powers and duties reasonably necessary
- 4 and convenient for the purposes of this chapter.
- 5 (1) Exercise general supervision of, and make rules and
- 6 regulations for the management of its department;
- 7 (2) Sign and execute in the name of the commission any
- 8 contract or agreement authorized by this chapter;
- 9 (3) Supervise the fiscal affairs and responsibilities of the
- 10 department;
- 11 (4) Obtain by lease or agreement, after receiving com-
- 12 petitive bids, lands and buildings required for the purposes
- 13 of this chapter. All such leases and agreements shall contain
- 14 a condition whereby such leases or agreements shall terminate
- 15 and all liability to the commission thereunder shall cease
- 16 and determine, should the sale of alcoholic liquors be pro-
- 17 hibited under the provisions of article five of this chapter.
- 18 Nothing herein contained shall empower the commission to
- 19 acquire title to any real estate, except that with the approval
- 20 of the Governor, the commission may purchase real estate for
- 21 the purpose of one warehouse to be centrally located and pay
- 22 therefor not to exceed sixty-seven thousand five hundred
- 23 dollars.

- 24 (5) Keep a complete and accurate record of all proceed-
- 25 ings, record and file all bonds and contracts taken or entered
- 26 into, and assume responsibility for the custody and preserva-
- 27 tion of all papers and documents pertaining to the commission;
- 28 (6) Purchase or lease as provided by law all equipment
- 29 necessary for the conduct of the department;
- 30 (7) Report to the Governor each year all information
- 31 relative to the operation and functions of the department.
- 32 They shall make such other reports and recommendations as
- 33 may be required by the Governor;
- 34 (8) Exercise any other power that may be necessary or
- 35 proper for the orderly conduct of the business and the effective
- 36 discharge of the duties of the commission;
- 37 (9) Invoke any legal or equitable remedies for the en-
- 38 forcement of the orders of the commission or the provisions
- 39 of this chapter;
- 40 (10) All writings required to be executed on behalf of the
- 41 commission shall be signed by the chairman and attested by
- 42 the secretary, except that in the absence of the chairman
- 43 such writing may be executed by the other two members.
