AN ACT to amend and reenact section one, article seven, chapter eighteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, relating to the appointment and contracts of principals and teachers, and providing penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section one, article seven, chapter eighteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Article 7. Teachers.

Section 1. Appointment of Principals and Teachers; Con-

- 2 tracts; Violations; Penalties. The board of education shall,
- 3 upon appointing teachers pursuant to section four, article
- 4 five of this chapter, fix their salaries as provided by section
- 5 two of this article.

- 6 Before entering upon their duties, all teachers shall execute
- 7 a contract with their boards of education, which contract
- 8 shall state the salary to be paid and shall be in the form
- 9 prescribed by the state superintendent of schools. Every such
- 10 contract shall be signed by the teacher and by the president
- 11 and secretary of the board of education, and when so signed
- 12 shall be filed, together with the certificate of the teacher,
- 13 by the secretary in the office of the board.
- 14 A teacher's contract, under this section, shall be a continu-
- 15 ing contract of employment and shall remain in full force
- 16 and effect except as modified by mutual consent of the school
- 17 board and the teacher, unless and until terminated with
- 18 written notice, stating cause or causes, to the teacher, by a
- 19 majority vote of the full membership of the board before
- 20 April first of the then current year, or by written resignation
- 21 of the teacher before that date. Such termination shall take
- 22 effect at the close of the school year in which the contract is
- 23 so terminated: Provided, however, That the contract may
- 24 be terminated at any time by mutual consent of the school
- 25 board and the teacher, and that this section shall not affect
- 26 the powers of a school board to suspend or dismiss a princi-

27	pal or teacher pursuant to section six of this article: Pro-
2 8	vided further, That a continuing contract shall not operate
29	to prevent a teacher's dismissal based upon the lack of need
30	for the teacher's services pursuant to the provisions of law
31	relating to the allocation of teachers and pupil-teacher ratios.
32	But in case of such dismissal, the teachers so dismissed shall
33	be placed upon a preferred list in the order of their length
34	of service, and the school board shall give due consideration
35	to such list and order if and when vacancies or need occur.
36	A superintendent shall not be deemed a teacher within the
37	meaning of this paragraph.
38	Any teacher who fails to fulfill his contract with the board,
39	unless prevented from so doing by personal illness or other
4 0	just cause, or unless released from such contract by the board,
41	or who violates any lawful provision thereof, shall be dis-
42	qualified to teach in any other public school in the state for
43	the period of the next ensuing school year: Provided, how-
44	ever, That marriage of a teacher shall not be considered a
45	failure to fulfill, or violation of, the contract: Provided, fur-
46	ther, That this act shall not become effective until on, or af-
47	ter July one, one thousand nine hundred forty.
