AN ACT to amend and reenact sections one and three, article three, chapter forty-four of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as last amended, relating to the appointment of commissioners of accounts, and providing for special commissioners of accounts in cases where the regularly appointed commissioner or commissioners of accounts cannot act or have resigned or been removed.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That sections one and three, article three, chapter forty-four of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as last amended, be amended and reenacted, to read as follows:

Section 1. *Commissioners of Accounts.* The county court
2 of each county shall appoint not more than four commission-
3 ers of accounts, except that in counties in which there exists a
4 separate tribunal for police and fiscal purposes, such tribunal
5 shall appoint such commissioners of accounts: *Provided, That*
6 in Barbour county there shall be appointed as aforesaid four
7 commissioners of accounts, not more than two of whom shall
8 be from the same political party.

Sec. 3. *Special Commissioners of Accounts.* When, from
2 any cause, none of the commissioners of accounts can act as to
3 any matter or matters which may be passed on under the
4 provisions of this chapter, such court or tribunal, as is men-
5 tioned in section one of this article, may appoint some other
6 person to act as to such matter or matters, and such person
7 shall have the power and compensation and perform the du-
8 ties of a commissioner of accounts. And when any commis-
9 sioner of accounts resigns, or is removed, such court or tri-
10 bunal may provide for the completion of the matters pre-
11 viously referred to such commissioner.
