AN ACT to amend and reenact section seventeen, article one, chapter forty-eight of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, relating to marriage out of the state to evade law.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That section seventeen, article one, chapter forty-eight of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 17. If any person resident of this state shall, in  
2 order to evade the law, and with an intention of returning

3 to reside in this state, go into another state or county, and  
4 there intermarry in violations of section one, article two  
5 of this chapter, and shall afterwards return and reside  
6 here such marriage shall be governed by the same law, in  
7 all respects, as if it had been solemnized in this state.
