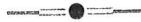

(By MR. MEREDITH)

[Passed March 5, 1945; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to amend article two, chapter thirty-three of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, by adding thereto a new section designated section forty-six, prohibiting an insurance company in this state from writing a public liability policy which contains a guest exclusion provision.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That article two, chapter thirty-three of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section designated section forty-six to read as follows:

**Article 4. General Provisions.**

Section 46. *Insurance Policies to Cover Injury to Guest*  
2 *or Invitee of Motor Vehicle Owner or Operator.*—No in-  
3 surance company, doing business in this state as provided

4 in this chapter, shall make, write or place any policy of  
5 bodily injury liability or property damage liability in-  
6 surance which, by its terms excludes coverage to the  
7 owner or operator of a motor vehicle on account of  
8 bodily injury to any guest or invitee of any such motor  
9 vehicle owner or operator.
