AN ACT to amend and reenact section one, article fourteen, chapter nineteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, relating to commercial feeding stuffs.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section one, article fourteen, chapter nineteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 1. *Definition.*—The term “commercial feeding
2 stuffs,” as used in this article, or in any rule or regulation
3 authorized thereunder, unless the context otherwise re-

4 quires or a different meaning is specifically prescribed,
5 shall mean all feeding stuffs used for feeding animals and
6 birds, except whole seeds or grains, the unmixed meals
7 made directly from the entire grains of corn, wheat, rye,
8 barley, oats, buckwheat, flaxseed, kafir and milo; whole
9 hays, straws and corn stover, when unmixed with other
10 materials, together with all other unmixed materials con-
11 taining sixty per cent or more of water.
