## House Bill No. 394

(By Mr. HARMER and Mr. TUCKER)

[Passed March 8, 1947; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section six, article seven, chapter six of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as last amended and reenacted by chapter thirty-eight, acts of the Legislature, regular session, one thousand nine hundred forty-five, relating to allowances to circuit judges for stationery, postage and stenographic work.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section six, article seven, chapter six of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as last amended and reenacted by chapter thirty-eight, acts of the Legislature, regular session, one thousand nine hundred forty-five, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

- Section 6. Allowances to Circuit Judges for Stationery,
- 2 Postage and Stenographic Work.—Each judge of the cir-

- 3 cuit court shall be reimbursed out of the state treasury
- 4 for the actual amounts expended by him for the procure-
- ment of necessary stationery, the payment of postage, and
- 6 the payment for stenographic work necessary in the dis-
- 7 charge of the duties of his office, not to exceed one hun-
- 8 dred and fifty dollars per month. Such sums shall be paid
- 9 monthly out of the state treasury, but not until the judge
- 10 submits an itemized statement covering the same.
- 11 All acts or parts of acts in conflict and inconsistent here-
- 12 with are hereby repealed.
