**Senate Bill No. 100**

(By MR. MORRIS)

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[Passed March 8, 1947; in effect from passage.]

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AN ACT to amend and reenact section eight, article two, chapter twenty-five-a of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to a special revenue fund administered by the director of the department of purchases for the volume purchase of commodities for use of all state departments, boards and institutions.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That section eight, article two, chapter twenty-five-a of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 8. *Revolving Fund for Volume Purchases.*—

2 For the purpose of permitting volume purchases of com-  
3 modities, consisting of office supplies, printing, binding  
4 and stationery for the use of all state departments, boards

5 and institutions, and for maintaining a stock of commod-  
6 ities in current use in state departments and institutions,  
7 there is hereby created a special revenue fund to be ad-  
8 ministered by the director of the department of purchases.  
9 The amount of the fund shall be fixed by the governor  
10 upon the recommendation of the director and if at the  
11 end of the fiscal year the cash balance plus inventory  
12 value exceeds the amount so fixed, the excess shall be  
13 transferred by the auditor to the general revenue fund  
14 and become a part of the general revenues of the state.  
15 In addition to paying for purchases herein described,  
16 there may be paid from the fund all costs of preserving  
17 inventories, including storage, equipment and salaries and  
18 wages of employees; such expenditures shall not exceed  
19 five thousand dollars annually. The fund shall be accu-  
20 mulated and administered as follows:

21 (1) The balance of the appropriations, and all accre-  
22 tions thereto, made under chapter nine, acts of the legis-  
23 lature one thousand nine hundred thirty-five, and subse-  
24 quent appropriations, shall be transferred to the special  
25 revenue fund.

26       (2) Charges for commodities sold to the various state  
27 departments, boards and institutions at a price to include  
28 total cost shall be deposited in the fund.

29       (3) To provide additional money for volume pur-  
30 chases the director, within his discretion, may require  
31 state departments, boards and institutions at the begin-  
32 ning of each fiscal year to transfer from appropriations  
33 for current expense to the fund, sums sufficient to pur-  
34 chase inventories for use during the fiscal year. The di-  
35 rector shall credit such transfers to the account of each  
36 department, board or institution and the cost of products  
37 purchased during the fiscal year shall be charged to the  
38 accounts of the respective departments, boards or insti-  
39 tutions. At the end of the fiscal year the balances of the  
40 accounts shall be returned to the appropriations from  
41 which they were transferred.
