House Bill No. 191

(By MR. SCHUPBACH and MR. WILKISON)

[Passed March 2; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section three, article five, chapter twenty-eight of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the duties, bond, and residence of the warden of West Virginia penitentiary.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section three, article five, chapter twenty-eight, of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 3. *Warden; Duties; Bond; Residence.*—The
2 warden shall be the chief executive officer of the peni-
3 tentiary, and shall have charge of its internal police and
4 management, and provide for feeding, clothing, working
5 and taking care of the convicts, subject to the control

6 of the state board of control. The warden shall prompt-
7 ly enforce all orders, rules and regulations made by the
8 board of control, enforce strict discipline among the
9 convicts, protect and preserve the property of the state,
10 and may for that purpose punish the convicts, or cause
11 them to be punished, in the manner authorized by the
12 board of control. He shall have the custody and control
13 of all the real and personal property at the penitentiary,
14 subject to the orders of the board of control. The warden
15 shall give bond in such sum as the board of control may
16 require, with one or more sureties satisfactory to the
17 board of control, conditioned for the faithful performance
18 of the duties of his office, and for accounting for and
19 paying over, as required by law, all moneys which may
20 come into his hands by virtue of such office, which bond,
21 when approved by the board of control, shall be filed
22 with and recorded by the treasurer of such board. The
23 warden shall reside in the warden's apartments at the
24 penitentiary, or at any other place in Marshall county,
25 convenient to the penitentiary, but shall not, by reason of
26 such residence, be entitled to vote in Marshall county.
