AN ACT to amend and reenact section fifteen, article nine, chapter sixty-two of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, relating to the statutory form of indictment for giving worthless check.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section fifteen, article nine, chapter sixty-two of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 15. *Indictment for Giving Worthless Check.*—

2 An indictment for giving a worthless check shall be
3 sufficient if it be in form, tenor or effect as follows (after
4 following the form in section one):

5 That A _____, on the _____
6 day of _____, nineteen _____
7 in the said county of _____, did unlawfully
8 and feloniously (if for a felony, or 'did unlawfully,' if for
9 a misdemeanor) issue and deliver unto B _____,
10 for value, with intent to defraud the said B _____,
11 his certain check (or draft) of the words and figures fol-
12 lowing: (here copy check or draft), when he, the said A
13 _____, knowingly did not have sufficient
14 funds on deposit in or credit with the said _____
15 bank of _____ with which to pay said check
16 (or draft), against the peace and dignity of the State.
