(By MR. HUBBARD)

[Passed February 18, 1953; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section five, article one, chapter thirty-one of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to duration of corporate existence.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section five, article one, chapter thirty-one of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 5. *Duration of Corporate Existence.*—Every
2 corporation formed hereunder, unless sooner dissolved,
3 shall have the right to perpetual succession. Any corpora-
4 tion chartered prior to January first, one thousand nine
5 hundred forty, which under its agreement of incorpora-
6 tion, had less than perpetual existence, is hereby granted
7 perpetual existence, provided all license fees and taxes

8 due the state of West Virginia shall have been paid to the
9 date of the enactment of this law.
