AN ACT to amend and reenact section two, article four, chapter twenty-six of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to admission to West Virginia home for aged and infirm colored.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section two, article four, chapter twenty-six of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 2. *Admission of Inmates.*—Any colored man or
2 woman who, because of extreme old age, or because of
3 feeble, infirm or impaired physical condition, is without
4 means to support himself or herself, and has no relatives,
5 friends or organization upon whom or which to depend
6 for care and support, shall be eligible for admission to
7 said home, provided his or her admission to the home

8 shall first have been recommended by the council of the
9 department of public assistance of the county of this
10 state in which the individual seeking admission resided
11 at the date of application therefor.
