[Passed February 24, 1959; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section eight, article six-a, chapter three of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to absentee voting by members of armed services, their spouses and members of their family.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section eight, article six-a, chapter three of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 8. *Persons Entitled to Vote Under the Provisions of This Article.*—Any person, man or woman, who is registered as a voter in any county of this state, who is a member of any branch of the armed services of the United States, and who in the performance of his duties expects to be absent on election day from the county

7 in which he is registered, or his wife or husband, or other
8 member of his family living with such person, may vote
9 by absent voter's ballot as provided in this article, whether
10 such person at the time of voting is within or without the
11 territorial limits of the United States.

12 Any other person may vote by absent voter's ballot only
13 as provided in article six, chapter three of this code.
