AN ACT to amend article nine, chapter nineteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated section twelve-b, relating to the possession, sale, distribution, or administration of unattenuated hog cholera virus.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That article nine, chapter nineteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated section twelve-b, to read as follows:

Section 12-b. *Possession, Sale, Distribution or Administration of Unattenuated Hog Cholera Virus.*—It shall be  
2 unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or association  
3 to sell or offer for sale, distribute, administer, barter,  
4 exchange, give away or otherwise dispose of unattenuated  
5

6 hog cholera virus except upon a special written permit  
7 issued by the commissioner of agriculture.

8 "Hog cholera virus" means an unattenuated virus ad-  
9 ministered to swine for the purpose of immunizing such  
10 swine against the disease known as hog cholera.
