[Passed February 1, 1960; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend article three, chapter sixty of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, by adding thereto a new section designated section nine-b, providing for an increase in the price of alcoholic liquors sold at state stores for the purpose of providing funds for a state temporary economic program.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That article three, chapter sixty of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section designated section nine-b, to read as follows:

Section 9-b. *Price Increase for State Temporary Economic Program.*—For the purpose of providing revenue for the state temporary economic program the commissioner in the exercise of his authority under section nine of this article is hereby directed to increase the price of alcoholic liquors in addition to the price increases provided in sections nine and nine-a hereof on or before the last day of March, one thousand nine hundred sixty, in an amount sufficient to produce an additional annual revenue of one million seven hundred fifty thousand dollars on an annual volume of business equal to the average for the last three years.
