(By MR. MYLES and MR. VICKERS)

[Passed March 7, 1961; in effect March 31, 1961.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact sections one-h, one-l and one-u, article two, chapter fifty-one of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the terms of courts in the eighth, twelfth and twenty-first judicial circuits.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That sections one-h, one-l and one-u, article two, chapter fifty-one of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 1-h. *Eighth Circuit.*—For the county of McDowell, on the fourth Monday in February, May, August and November.

Sec. 1-l. *Twelfth Circuit.*—For the county of Fayette, on the second Tuesday in January, May and September.

Sec. 1-u. *Twenty-first Circuit.*—For the county of Grant,
2 on the first Tuesday in April, the second Tuesday in July
3 and the first Tuesday in November.

4 For the county of Mineral, on the second Tuesday in
5 January, the first Tuesday in May and the first Tuesday
6 in September.

7 For the county of Tucker, on the second Tuesday in
8 February, the first Tuesday in June and the first Tuesday
9 in October.
