Senate Bill No. 193

(By MR. DAVIS)

[Passed March 12, 1965; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section three, article two, chapter fifty-seven of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, to allow, in criminal prosecutions for false swearing, the use of statements made by the accused persons as witnesses upon legal examinations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section three, article two, chapter fifty-seven of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 3. Statement by Accused Upon Legal Examination.—In a criminal prosecution other than for perjury or false swearing, evidence shall not be given against

- 4 the accused of any statement made by him as a witness
- 5 upon a legal examination.
