[Passed March 11, 1965; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend article one, chapter five-a of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated section two-b, and to amend and reenact section one, article four of said chapter, relating to appointment of security officers by the commissioner of finance and administration, the authority and powers of such officers, the removal of the authority of the director of the general services division to appoint guards, and some of the general duties and responsibilities of such director.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That article one, chapter five-a of the code of West Virginia,

one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated section two-b; and that section one, article four of said chapter be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

Article 1. Department of Finance and Administration.

Section 2-b. Security Officers; Appointment; Oath; 2 Carrying Weapons; Powers and Duties Generally, etc.-3 In addition to the other powers given and assigned to the commissioner in this chapter, he is hereby authorized to 4 appoint bona fide residents of this state to act as security 5 officers upon any premises owned or leased by the state 6 7 of West Virginia and under the jurisdiction of the commissioner, subject to the conditions and restrictions here-8 9 inafter imposed. Before entering upon the performance 10 of his duties as such security officer, each person so appointed shall qualify therefor in the same manner as is 11 required of constables by the taking and filing of an 12 oath of office as required by article one, chapter six of 13 this code. No such person shall have authority to carry 14 a gun or any other dangerous weapon until he shall have 15 obtained a license therefor in the manner prescribed by 16

section two, article seven, chapter sixty-one of this code. 17 18 It shall be the duty of any person so appointed and qualified to preserve law and order on any premises 19 20under the jurisdiction of the commissioner to which he may be assigned by the commissioner. For this purpose 21 22 he shall as to offenses committed on such premises have 23and may exercise all the powers and authority and shall 24 be subject to all the responsibilities of regularly elected 25 constables of the county. The assignment of security officers to any premises under the jurisdiction of the 26 commissioner shall not be deemed to supersede in any 27 28 way the authority or duty of other peace officers to preserve law and order on such premises. 29

The commissioner may at his pleasure revoke the authority of any such officer by filing a notice to that effect in the office of the clerk of each county in which his oath of office was filed, and in the case of officers licensed to carry a gun or other dangerous weapons by notifying the clerk of the circuit court of the county in which the license therefor was granted.

Article 4. General Services Division.

Section 1. Care, Control and Custody of Capitol Build-2 ings and Grounds.-The director shall be charged with 3 the full responsibility for the care, control and custody of the capitol buildings and in this connection he shall: 4 5 (1) Furnish janitors for the capitol buildings and grounds, together with all the departments therein, or 6 connected therewith, regardless of the budget or budgets, 7 8 departmental or otherwise, from which such janitors 9 are paid, and shall furnish janitorial supplies, light, heat and ventilation for all the rooms and corridors of the 10 buildings. Under the direction of the president of the 11 12 senate and speaker of the house of delegates, the director shall have charge of the halls and committee rooms of 13 14 the two houses and any other quarters at the state capitol provided for the use of the Legislature or its staff, and 15 keep the same properly cleaned, warmed and in good 16 order, and shall do and perform such other duties in 17 relation thereto as either house may require; 18

19 (2) Furnish messenger service to the various state20 departments. Department heads shall be consulted with

21 reference to the amount of messenger service required for their departments. Janitor-messengers, or messengers, 22 shall receive from the director compensation for total 23 24 services in the same manner as other employees are paid. 25 (3) Have immediate control and direction of the switchboard telephone service for the various depart-2627 ments of the state capitol. Changes in telephone instruments or equipment in the various departments of the 28 29state capitol shall be referred to the director, and payment for any such changes will not be honored unless 30 such changes have been approved by the director. A 3132simple accounting system shall be installed and maintained by the director for all telephone service to the 33 state departments; 34

(4) Landscape and take care of the lawns and gardens;
(5) Direct the making of all minor repairs to and alterations of the capitol buildings and governor's mansion
and the grounds of such buildings and mansion. Major
repairs and alterations shall be made under the supervision of the director, subject to the direction of the board.
The offices of the assistants and employees appointed

42 to perform these duties shall be located where desig-43 nated by the board, except that they shall not be located 44 in any of the legislative chambers, offices, rooms or halls. 45 Office hours shall be so arranged that emergency or tele-46 phone service shall be available at all times. The hours 47 of employment shall be so arranged that janitorial serv-48 ice shall not interfere with other employment during 49 regular office hours.
