Senate Bill No. 190

(By MR. MCKOWN and MR. HATCHER)

[Passed March 11, 1967; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section thirty-nine, article five, chapter eighteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the establishment of summer school programs and the crediting and expending of tuitions accruing therefrom within the general current expense fund of county boards of education.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section thirty-nine, article five, chapter eighteen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 5. COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION.**§18-5-39. Establishment of summer school programs; tuition.**

Inasmuch as the present county school facilities for the
2 most part lie dormant and unused during the summer
3 months, and inasmuch as there are many students who are
4 in need of remedial instruction and others who desire
5 accelerated instruction, it is the purpose of this section
6 to provide for the establishment of a summer school pro-
7 gram, which program is to be separate and apart from
8 the full school term as established by each county.

9 The board of education of any county shall have au-
10 thority to establish a summer school program utilizing the
11 public school facilities and to charge tuition for students
12 who attend such summer school, such tuitions not to ex-
13 ceed in any case the actual cost of operation of such sum-
14 mer school program: *Provided*, That any deserving pupil
15 whose parents, in the judgment of the board, are unable
16 to pay such tuition, may attend without charge. The
17 county board of education shall have the authority to
18 determine the term and curriculum of such summer
19 schools based upon the particular needs of the individual

20 county. The curriculum may include, but is not limited to,
21 remedial instruction, accelerated instruction, and the
22 teaching of manual arts. The term of such summer school
23 program may not be established in such a manner as to
24 interfere with the regular school term.

25 The county boards of education may employ as teachers
26 for this summer school program any certified teacher.
27 Certified teachers employed by the county board of edu-
28 cation to teach in the summer school program shall be
29 paid an amount to be determined by the board and shall
30 enter into a contract of employment in such form as is
31 prescribed by the county board of education.

32 Any funds accruing from such tuitions shall be credited
33 to and expended within the existing framework of the
34 general current expense fund of the county board of
35 education.
