AN ACT to repeal article two, chapter twenty-six and articles two and four, chapter twenty-eight of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the West Virginia colored orphans' home, the industrial home for colored boys and the industrial home for colored girls.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

§1. Repeal of statutory provisions relating to West Virginia colored orphans' home, industrial home for colored boys and industrial home for colored girls.

2 four, chapter twenty-eight, all of the code of West Vir-

3 ginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended,

4 are hereby repealed.
