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[Passed January 30, 1970; in effect from passage.]

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AN ACT to amend and reenact section two, article five, chapter ten of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the West Virginia Broadcasting authority.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That section two, article five, chapter ten of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

**ARTICLE 5. EDUCATIONAL BROADCASTING AUTHORITY.**

**§10-5-2. West Virginia educational broadcasting authority; members; organization; officers; employees; meetings; expenses.**

- 1 The West Virginia educational broadcasting authority,
- 2 heretofore created, is hereby continued as a public benefit

3 corporation. It shall consist of nine members, who shall  
4 be citizens and residents of the state, of whom one shall  
5 be the state superintendent of schools, one shall be a  
6 member of the West Virginia board of education to be  
7 selected by it annually, and one shall be the chancellor  
8 of the West Virginia board of regents. The other six  
9 members shall be appointed by the governor by and  
10 with the advice and consent of the Senate for overlapping  
11 terms of six years. The present members of the authority  
12 shall continue to serve out the terms to which they were  
13 appointed. Any vacancy among the appointive members  
14 shall be filled by the governor by appointment for the  
15 unexpired term.

16 The chairman and vice chairman of the authority as  
17 of the effective date of this article (March 10, 1967)  
18 shall continue in their respective offices until their suc-  
19 cessors are elected. Thereafter, at its first regular meeting  
20 in each year the authority shall elect one of its members  
21 as chairman and one as vice chairman. The authority  
22 is authorized to select an executive secretary and such  
23 other personnel as may be necessary to perform its duties

24 and to fix the compensation of such personnel to be paid  
25 out of moneys appropriated for this purpose. The exe-  
26 cutive secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings  
27 of the authority and shall perform such other duties as  
28 it may prescribe. The authority is authorized to estab-  
29 lish such office or offices as may be necessary for the  
30 proper performance of its duties.

31 The authority shall hold one meeting in July of each  
32 year and at least two additional meetings at such times  
33 and places as it may prescribe. It may meet at such  
34 other times as may be necessary, such meetings to be  
35 held upon its own resolution or at the call of the chair-  
36 man of the authority. The members shall serve without  
37 compensation, but every member may be reimbursed  
38 for actual expenses incident to the performance of his  
39 duties upon presentation to the chairman of an itemized  
40 sworn statement thereof.
