[Passed April 14, 1973; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section one, article four, chapter five-a of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the general services division of the department of finance and administration; relating to the care, control and custody of the capitol buildings and governor's mansion and the grounds thereof; relating to messenger and telephone services; relating to repairs to and alterations of the capitol buildings and governor's mansion; prohibiting any structural change in the capitol buildings until the same is approved by the governor and a line-item appropriation is made therefor; relating to rules and regulations in connection therewith; providing for a forfeiture of pay for violating prohibition; and relating to offices and office hours of certain assistants and employees of such general services division.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section one, article four, chapter five-a of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 4. GENERAL SERVICES DIVISION.

§5A-4-1. Care, control and custody of capitol buildings and grounds; messenger and telephone services; structural changes provided prohibited without approval and line-item appropriation; forfeiture; offices and hours.

1 The director shall be charged with the full responsibility

2 for the care, control and custody of the capitol buildings
3 and in this connection he shall:

4 (1) Furnish janitors for the capitol buildings and grounds,
5 together with all the departments therein, or connected
6 therewith, regardless of the budget or budgets, departmen-
7 tal or otherwise, from which such janitors are paid, and
8 shall furnish janitorial supplies, light, heat and ventilation
9 for all the rooms and corridors of the buildings. Under the
10 direction of the president of the Senate and speaker of the
11 House of Delegates, the director shall have charge of the
12 halls and committee rooms of the two houses and any
13 other quarters at the state capitol provided for the use of
14 the Legislature or its staff, and keep the same properly
15 cleaned, warmed and in good order, and shall do and per-
16 form such other duties in relation thereto as either house
17 may require;

18 (2) Furnish messenger service to the various state
19 departments. Department heads shall be consulted with
20 reference to the amount of messenger service required for
21 their departments. Janitor-messengers, or messengers,
22 shall receive from the director compensation for total ser-
23 vices in the same manner as other employees are paid;

24 (3) Have immediate control and direction of the
25 switchboard telephone service for the various depart-
26 ments of the state capitol. Changes in telephone instru-
27 ments or equipment in the various departments of the
28 state capitol shall be referred to the director, and payment
29 for any such changes will not be honored unless such
30 changes have been approved by the director. A simple
31 accounting system shall be installed and maintained by the
32 director for all telephone service to the state departments;

33 (4) Landscape and take care of the lawns and gardens;

34 (5) Direct the making of all minor repairs to and alter-
35 ations of the capitol buildings and governor's mansion
36 and the grounds of such buildings and mansion. Major re-
37 pairs and alterations shall be made under the supervision
38 of the director, subject to the direction of the governor:
39 *Provided*, That it shall be unlawful for any structural
40 change to be made in any of the capitol buildings,
41 whether at the instance of an elected or appointed officer
42 of this state, until the plans for such proposed structural

43 change have been submitted to the governor and the
44 Legislature and such proposed structural change has been
45 approved by the governor and is specifically and express-
46 ly authorized by a line-item appropriation in the budget or
47 in a supplementary appropriation measure. The director
48 shall promulgate rules and regulations, which rules and
49 regulations shall be subject to the approval of the gover-
50 nor, to implement the provisions of this subdivision (5)
51 and to establish criteria to be considered in evaluating the
52 plans for any such proposed structural change. All such
53 rules and regulations shall be formulated for the express
54 purpose of preserving and maintaining the architectural
55 integrity of the capitol buildings. Any officer who causes
56 any such structural change to be made contrary to the
57 provisions of this subdivision (5) or any such rules and
58 regulations shall forfeit from his pay from the state of
59 West Virginia the sum of five thousand dollars.

60 The offices of the assistants and employees appointed
61 to perform these duties shall be located where designated
62 by the governor, except that they shall not be located in
63 any of the legislative chambers, offices, rooms or halls.
64 Office hours shall be so arranged that emergency or tele-
65 phone service shall be available at all times. The hours of
66 employment shall be so arranged that janitorial service
67 shall not interfere with other employment during regular
68 office hours.
