AN ACT to amend and reenact section four, article two-a, chapter seventeen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to selection, organization, classification, etc., of personnel; business manager and chief engineer assistants; employees' bonds.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section four, article two-a, chapter seventeen of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2A. WEST VIRGINIA COMMISSIONER OF HIGHWAYS.

§17-2A-4. Selection, organization, classification, etc., of personnel; business manager and chief engineer assistants; employees' bonds.

1 The commissioner shall be in charge of and responsible
2 for the selection, employment and effective organization of
3 all commission personnel for the entire state road and high-
4 way program. He may establish such divisions, sections and
5 other functional and organizational units within the com-
6 mission as may be necessary and practical in the full and
7 effective discharge of the duties and responsibilities of his
8 office. Except as otherwise provided by law, all commission
9 personnel shall be classified pursuant to the job classifica-
10 tion system and shall be paid pursuant to the salary scale
11 established by the commissioner.

12 The commissioner shall select and employ a business
13 manager assistant and one or more chief engineer assis-
14 tants who shall be registered professional engineers, and
15 shall establish such other offices, activities, divisions, sec-
16 tions and organizational units as may be necessary and

17 practical. The business manager assistant shall be in charge
18 of and responsible for matters of finance and such other
19 functions as may be assigned to him from time to time by
20 the commissioner. The chief engineer assistant or, if the
21 commissioner has selected and employed more than one
22 chief engineer assistant, the chief engineer assistants shall
23 be in charge of and responsible for planning, equipment,
24 materials, construction, maintenance, and such other func-
25 tions as may be designated by the commissioner as well as
26 such other functions as may from time to time be assigned
27 to such chief engineer assistant or assistants by the com-
28 missioner.

29 The commissioner shall require every employee who
30 collects fees or handles funds or who has custody or con-
31 trol of equipment or supplies belonging to the state to
32 give bond, with such sureties and in such penal sum, as may
33 be approved by the commissioner, for the faithful discharge
34 of each such employee's duties and his accounting for all
35 such fees, funds, equipment and supplies coming into his
36 hands or under his custody or control. All such bonds,
37 when approved by the commissioner, shall be filed in the
38 office of the secretary of state. Premiums on all such bonds
39 shall be paid from commission funds.
