AN ACT to amend and reenact section one, article three, chapter twenty-eight of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to industrial home for girls and deleting from the code the requirement that all officers, agents and servants for the internal management of the home shall be women.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section one, article three, chapter twenty-eight of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 3. INDUSTRIAL HOME FOR GIRLS.

§28-3-1. Continuation; management.

1 The West Virginia industrial home for girls, heretofore
2 established and located at Industrial, in Harrison County,
3 shall be continued, and shall be exclusively charged with the
4 care, training and reformation of girls committed to its
5 custody. It shall be managed, directed and controlled as
6 prescribed in article one, chapter twenty-five of this code.
