AN ACT to amend and reenact section one-a, article four, chapter five-a of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the regulation of parking on state-owned property in Charleston; fee for unauthorized parking; and responsibility for collection thereof by the commissioner of the department of finance and administration.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section one-a, article four, chapter five-a of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 4. GENERAL SERVICES DIVISION.

§5A-4-1a. Regulation of parking on state-owned property in Charleston; penalties; jurisdiction.

1 The commissioner is vested with authority to regulate park-
2 ing of motor vehicles in accordance with the provisions of
3 this section with regard to the following state-owned property
4 in the city of Charleston, Kanawha county:

5 (a) The east side of Duffy street between Kanawha boulev-
6 vard and Washington street, east;

7 (b) The west side of California avenue between Kanawha
8 boulevard and Washington street, east;

9 (c) In the circle between the east and west wings of the
10 state capitol;

11 (d) Upon the state-owned grounds upon which state of-
12 fice building no. 3, 1800 Washington street, east, is located;

13 (e) Upon the state-owned grounds upon which state office
14 building no. 4, 112 California avenue, is located;

15 (f) In the state-owned parking garage at 212 California
16 avenue and upon the state-owned grounds upon which such
17 parking garage is located;

18 (g) Upon the state-owned property at Michigan avenue
19 and Virginia terrace;

20 (h) Upon any other property now or hereafter owned by
21 the state and used for parking purposes in conjunction with
22 the state capitol or state office buildings nos. 3 and 4.

23 The commissioner is authorized to promulgate rules and
24 regulations respecting parking and to allocate parking spaces
25 to public officers and employees of the state upon all of the
26 aforementioned property of the state: *Provided*: That all park-
27 ing spaces in the circle between the east and west wings of
28 the state capitol shall at all times be kept available for park-
29 ing by visitors at the capitol: *Provided, however*, That during
30 sessions of the Legislature parking on the east side of Duffy
31 street between Kanawha boulevard and Washington street,
32 east, and the west side of California avenue between Kanawha
33 boulevard and Washington street, east, and in the circle be-
34 tween the east and west wings of the capitol shall be subject to
35 rules and regulations promulgated jointly by the speaker of the
36 House of Delegates and the president of the Senate. Any per-
37 son parking any vehicle without authorization and contrary to
38 the rules and regulations promulgated under authority of this
39 section shall be charged a fee of two dollars. The commissioner
40 shall collect all such charges and pay the same into the general
41 revenue fund of the state.

42 All such charges are hereby declared to be debts owing to the
43 state, for which the debtor shall be personally liable, and the
44 commissioner, if necessary, may make collection by appropriate
45 civil action in any court of competent jurisdiction. The com-
46 missioner is authorized to employ such persons as may be
47 necessary to enforce the parking rules and regulations pro-
48 mulgated under the provisions of this section.
