AN ACT to amend and reenact section one-a, article four, chapter five-a of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the regulation of parking on state-owned property in Charleston; penalties; jurisdiction; removal of vehicles.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section one-a, article four, chapter five-a of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 4. GENERAL SERVICES DIVISION.

§5A-4-1a. Regulation of parking on state-owned property in Charleston; penalties; jurisdiction.

1 The commissioner is vested with authority to regulate
2 parking of motor vehicles in accordance with the provi-
3 sions of this section with regard to the following state-
4 owned property in the city of Charleston, Kanawha
5 county:

6 (a) The east side of Greenbrier Street be-
7 tween Kanawha Boulevard and Washington Street,
8 East;

9 (b) The west side of California Avenue between Kan-
10 awha Boulevard and Washington Street, East;

11 (c) In the circle between the east and west wings
12 of the state capitol;

13 (d) Upon the state-owned grounds upon which state
14 Office Building No. 3, 1800 Washington Street, East, is
15 located;

16 (e) Upon the state-owned grounds upon which state
17 Office Building No. 4, 112 California Avenue, is located;

18 (f) In the state-owned parking garage at 212 California
19 Avenue and upon the state-owned grounds upon which
20 such parking garage is located;

21 (g) Upon the state-owned property at Michigan Ave-
22 nue and Virginia Terrace;

23 (h) Upon the state-owned science and cultural center
24 parking lot;

25 (i) Upon any other property now or hereafter owned
26 by the state and used for parking purposes in conjunction
27 with the state capitol or state Office Buildings Nos. 3 and 4.

28 The commissioner is authorized to promulgate rules and
29 regulations respecting parking and to allocate parking
30 spaces to public officers and employees of the state upon
31 all of the aforementioned property of the state: *Provided*,
32 That all parking spaces in the circle between the east
33 and west wings of the state capitol shall at all times be
34 kept available for parking by visitors at the capitol:
35 *Provided, however*, That during sessions of the Legisla-
36 ture parking on the east side of Greenbrier Street between
37 Kanawha Boulevard and Washington Street, East, in the
38 science and cultural center parking lot and in the circle
39 between the east and west wings of the capitol shall be
40 subject to rules and regulations promulgated jointly by
41 the speaker of the House of Delegates and the president
42 of the Senate. Any person parking any vehicle contrary to
43 the rules and regulations promulgated under authority
44 of this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than
45 one dollar nor more than twenty-five dollars for each
46 offense. In addition, the commissioner may cause the re-
47 moval at owner expense of any vehicle that is parked in
48 violation of such rules and regulations. Magistrates in
49 Kanawha county shall have jurisdiction of all such of-
50 fenses.

51 The commissioner is authorized to employ such persons
52 as may be necessary to enforce the parking rules and
53 regulations promulgated under the provisions of this sec-
54 tion.
